

How to apply to a programme

Application forms for individual programmes can be found on the websites. Applicants must submit a letter of recommendation, copies of transcripts/diplomas from previous academic work and a statement of motivation.

Application fees are waived if applications are received before February 1, 2015.

Tuition

Tuition **includes** all excursions, online readers, lunches on class days, access to the university's libraries and computer facilities.

The tuition does not include travel to and from Amsterdam nor housing.
